Panelist 1: - Sialou Madeleine

Dr. Sialou Madeleine is presently working as lecturer at the National Advanced Institute of Arts and Culture (INSAAC) in Abidjan (Cote d'Ivoire). Her research interest concerns cultural development with a specific focus on women role in the emergence of cultural economy and youth involvement in the process. She is also involved in public administration as assistant Director (MCF), regional advisor, municipal Councilor (Kounahiri).

Maria Matui is a Tanzanian climate justice advocate and gender equality champion.
