PROFILE OF GUESTS, SPEAKERS AND PANELISTS



H. E. Gautam Rana Ambassador US Embassy, Slovakia

Gautam Rana is the Ambassador of the United States of America to the Slovak Republic from September 2022. A career member of the Senior Foreign Service, Ambassador Rana previously served as the Deputy Chief of Mission and long-term Chargé d'Affaires ad interim at the Embassies of the United States in Algeria and Slovenia. He also served as a Director for Afghanistan and Pakistan at the National Security Council (NSC) from 2014-15. Prior to the NSC, he was the Deputy Minister Counselor for Political Affairs at the American Embassy in New Delhi. From 2009-10, Ambassador Rana worked for Deputy Secretary of State James Steinberg as Special Assistant for South and Central Asia, the Middle East, and counterterrorism. Prior to joining the Deputy Secretary's staff, he was the Special Assistant to Assistant Secretary for European and Eurasian Affairs Daniel Fried. His overseas diplomatic postings also include Khost, Afghanistan; Peshawar, Pakistan; and Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates. Prior to joining the Foreign Service in 2002, he was a staff attorney with the Legal Aid Society in New York City, and a civil rights fellow with the National Asian Pacific American Legal Consortium. He speaks Hindi, Gujarati, and Spanish, and has studied French, Slovenian, Arabic, and Pashto. He is currently learning Slovak. Ambassador Rana has degrees in Economics and International Relations from the University of Pennsylvania, a law degree from Vanderbilt University, and a Master of Arts in Strategic Security Studies from the National Defense University. He is married, with two children.

OPENING REMARKS



Heather RogersDeputy Chief of Mission
US Embassy, Slovakia

Heather Rogers joined U.S. Embassy Bratislava as the Deputy Chief of Mission in July 2024. Before she served as the Economic Counselor at U.S. Embassy Warsaw (2020-23) overseeing bilateral economic relationship and supporting Poland's response to the 2022 Russian invasion of Ukraine and largest displacement of refugees in Europe since WW II. Heather worked as the Deputy Economic Chief at U.S. Embassy Hanoi (2015-18), where she helped lead a team to improve the overall economic, trade and labor relationship and Vietnam's chairmanship of APEC. As the senior Burma Desk Officer in the Bureau of East Asian and Pacific Affairs (2012-14) in Washington DC, Heather was part of a team that won recognition for significantly advancing democratic values. Ás a Watch Officer in the Executive Secretariat's Operations Center (2011-12) in Washington DC, she supported the Secretary of State's global reach. Her consular tour was at Embassy Bogota (2009-11), during Colombia's internal and armed conflict when violence displaced hundreds of thousands every year. Heather's first tour was serving as the human rights officer at Embassy New Delhi (2006-08). Before joining the Foreign Service in 2006, Heather served as a Presidential Management Fellow and civil servant at the Department of State. She worked as the Public Diplomacy Desk Officer for India, Nepal and Sri Lanka in the Bureau of South and Central Asian Affairs (2003-06), in the political section at Embassy Skopje (2002-03), and with the Office of Inspector General (2001-02). Heather earned a BA from the College of Saint Benedict/St. John's University, a Masters in Public Administration from Rutgers University, and a Masters of Science in national security and resource strategy from National Defense University. She has studied Slovak, Polish, Vietnamese and Spanish. Heather is married to American diplomat, and they have three children and a dog.







Lýdia Tobiášová Executive Director Fulbright Slovakia

Lýdia Tobiášová assumed the position of the Executive Director at Fulbright Commission in June 2020. She holds an M.A. and Ph.D. from the Faculty of Law, Comenius University in Bratislava. During her professional years, she served on different positions in academia and civil service. She was an Assistant Professor at the Department of Criminal Law in 2007-2015, teaching criminal law courses and publishing in law journals and textbooks. She has been awarded with several scholarships abroad, including Fulbright Scholar Program at Fordham Law School in New York City and Pittsburgh University School of Law as a recipient of Ruth Crawford Mitchell Fellowship. She acted as a Vice-Dean for International Relations and Erasmus Mobility Coordinator in 2011-15. In 2015, Lýdia joined the Slovak Ministry of Defence as a legal adviser at international law department focusing on international law, international humanitarian law and law of armed conflict, and was engaged in several professional courses with Defense Institute of International Legal Studies in Newport, Rhode Island, funded by the U.S. Department of Defense. As a proud Fulbright Alumna she also served as a Board Member at Slovak Fulbright Alumni Association in 2018-19.

PANEL DISCUSSION I: Strengthening Civil Society Through NGO Work



Laura Dittel Humphrey Fellow Syracuse University, 2014-2015

Laura Dittel is the executive director of the Carpathian Foundation (Karpatská nadácia) in Košice, Slovakia. She has spent most of her professional life in the civil sector, establishing non-profit organizations and serving on different advisory boards. She was a member of the Governmental Council for NGOs – a permanent advisory body to the Slovak Government until 2024 – and other platforms focusing on the development of an enabling environment for NGOs and the defense of civil society. Four years of service on the Executive Committee and Working Group 2 of The Eastern Partnership Civil Society Forum helped her understand the specifics of civil society in these six post-Soviet countries and provided space for sharing the Slovak experience from the EU pre-accession process. Laura graduated from the Faculty of Public Administration at the University of P. J. Šafárik in Košice, and in 2014, she was awarded the Humphrey Fellowship, which allowed her to study leadership, NGO governance, and conflict management.



Alena Vachnová Humphrey Fellow Boston University, 2017-2018

Alena Vachnová is an accomplished professional who has dedicated her career to equitable development and social justice. She has studied law and social work and earned a Master of Public Administration degree from Harvard Kennedy School. Her focus for the past decade has been on ending homelessness by promoting and developing affordable rental housing and building integrated health and social services for homeless families and individuals in Košice and Prešov. As the Chair of the Board of Directors of the DEDO Foundation, she is committed to advocating for systemic change and a paradigm shift from managing to ending homelessness. To achieve this, Alena is actively involved in various governmental working groups at the national and European levels. Alena's accomplishments include being a two-time Fulbright scholar and receiving the SDGs 2022 prize for sustainable development from the PONTIS Foundation.







Arian Boci Humphrey Fellow Virginia Commonwealth University, 2007-2008

Arian Boci, Ph.D., M.P.H, M.Sc, is the director of the Institute for Health, Social Policy, and Research Development, an NGO supporting vulnerable communities in Albania. He is an experienced program manager and researcher with 20+ years of national and international experience. He has a strong track record in public health issues, gender and social inclusion, thought leadership, and program management. He has worked extensively with Civil Society Organizations, media, and community organizations to strengthen community rights and governance transparency. He has consulted for the European Commission, UN Agencies, WHO, the Global Fund, and prestigious U.S. organizations. He is a well-known researcher, published author, and peer reviewer for the Bulletin of the WHO and the International Journal of Prison Health. He is a part-time lecturer at Albanian medical universities and serves as a Goodwill Ambassador of Arkansas State and an Honorary Citizenship Diplomat in Georgia, USA.



Iryna Drobovych Humphrey Fellow University of Minnesota, 2023-2024

Iryna Drobovych is a civil society leader in Ukraine and an advocate for gender equality and democracy. She co-founded the Foundation 'The Day After,' a nonprofit promoting women's leadership, national unity, and preparing the women's movement for post-war peacebuilding. During Humphrey Fellowship, she expanded her expertise on gender policy and women's role in post-war recovery. She is a visiting scholar at the U.S. Institute of Peace (Washington, D.C.) and a fellow at the Salzburg Global Seminar. Iryna is a National Consultant on women's leadership, and recovery at UN Women Ukraine. Previously, she was CEO and Strategy Director at the Ukrainian Women's Congress (2019-23), Government Relations Advisor with the Kyiv Security Forum and Open Ukraine Foundation (2016-19), and Executive Assistant to the Prime Minister of Ukraine (2014-16). Iryna holds a BA in International Relations and an MA in International Strategies and Security from Kyiv National Taras Shevchenko University. She completed the Good Governance program at the Ukrainian Catholic University and the Sustainable Public Management program at the Swedish Institute.



Marijan Mišić Humphrey Fellow Pennsylvania State University, 2020-2021

Dr. Marijan Mišić, born in Niš (Serbia), holds a PhD in Comparative Literature, earned in 2015 after completing his undergraduate studies in Serbian Literature and Language at the Faculty of Philosophy in Niš. In 2021, he was a Humphrey Fellow at Penn State University, enriching his international academic and professional experience in educational planning, administration, and policy. Dr. Mišić currently serves as the CAS/EE Coordinator in the IBDP program at Grammar School "Svetozar Marković" and as Grants Manager at the National Coalition for Decentralization. From 2015 to 2022, he held the role of school principal and was a member of the National Board of Grammar School Directors in Serbia. He has contributed to various Ministry of Education working groups, focusing on educational policy reform and IBDP program implementation in Serbia. His expertise includes grant management, project development, monitoring and evaluation, and research and analysis in the civic sector.





PANEL DISCUSSION II: Social and Economic Development as a Condition for Talent Retention



Lívia Eľková Humphrey Fellow University of Minnesota, 2023-2024

Lívia Eľková is a specialist in state social policy and works at the Department of Social Affairs in Slovakia's Central Office of Labor, Social Affairs, and Family. During her professional career, she has held leading positions in important roles, especially in social benefit systems. With 20+ years of experience in the public sector and state administration, she has a strong background in policy formulation, public financial management, social work, and leadership. Lívia holds a Doctorate in Andragogy as well as a Ph.D. in Social Work from the St. Elizabeth University of Health and Social Work in Bratislava and earned MBA degrees in Executive Master of Business Administration. During her fellowship, she learned about US approaches to addressing the rights and needs of refugee children and deepened her knowledge and skills related to social policy design, implementation, and evaluation, as well as public finance management and leadership.



Andrea Danihelová Humphrey Fellow Michigan State University, 2020-2021

Andrea Danihelová has been the Head of the Communication Department and spokesperson for the Slovak-German energy company based in Košice since 2005. Since April 2024, she has been working as a freelancer in PR. She studied English and American Studies at Matej Bel University in Banská Bystrica. In 2021, she completed the Humphrey Fellowship Program focusing on economic development. She has extensive experience in PR, retail marketing, as well as various international projects within the EU. She began her career as a project manager at the Slovak Chamber of Commerce and Industry in Košice and later worked as a marketing manager for a foreign retail company. Andrea is actively involved in charity work, focusing mainly on helping families in need of accessible social housing. She also mentors high school principals and program coordinators within the Duke of Edinburgh's Award (DofE) program and serves on various committees for international events and PR competitions.



Arlind Rama Humphrey Fellow University of Minnesota, 2018-2019

Dr. Arlind Rama was a Humphrey Fellow at the Humphrey School of Public Affairs, where he studied Public Policy Design. Upon his return, he joined PwC as the leader of Public Sector Advisory and helped establish advisory operations in Albania and Kosovo. In 2022, Arlind co-founded ICG Research, a research center based in Tirana focused on socio-economic welfare and the public-private nexus in the Western Balkans Region. Since 2023, he has served as Senior Manager at the Tony Blair Institute for Global Change, providing strategic advice to the Government of Albania on economic transformation and industrial policies. Arlind is a lecturer in the Faculty of Economy, University of Tirana.







Ana Simonovska Humphrey Fellow Duke University, 2019-2020

Dr. Ana Simonovska is an Associate Professor at the Institute of Agricultural Economics, Faculty of Agricultural Sciences and Food, 'Ss. Cyril and Methodius' University in Skopje, where she completed her PhD in Agricultural Economics. She earned her MSc in Business Administration from University of Agricultural Sciences in Uppsala, Department of Economics. Currently, she teaches Statistics and Financial Management, Advisory Services and Communication, Rural Finance, and Mathematical and Statistical Methods, and Scientific and Research Methods and Statistics. Her research interests cover a range of topics in agricultural economics and rural development, including farm financial and investment performance, agricultural credit and land markets, community development, and socio-economic aspects of rural areas. She is the author and co-author of 70+ scientific and has contributed to developing national strategic documents and legislation. She has been a Deputy Member of the Working Group on Land Consolidation at the Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry, and Water Economy since 2023. She has also been a Deputy Member of the IPARD Monitoring Committee since 2020; a Member of the Working Group on Advisory Services (2022-24); and a Member of the Council for Monitoring and Coordination of ASARD and AKIS since 2024.



Mario Mara Milakovic Humphrey Fellow Michigan State University, 2021-2022

Mario Mara Milakovic is an award-winning entrepreneur and consultant committed to working in the fields of social entrepreneurship and diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI). A firm believer in the power of sustainable social enterprise, Milakovic founded Super Bake in 2018, a social enterprise that reintegrates senior women into the workforce on a part-time basis to combat ageism and social isolation, providing opportunities for meaningful engagement through baking and selling authentic local goods. Milakovic holds a BA in Fine Arts and MA in Cultural and Gender Studies and is currently a PhD candidate at the University of Belgrade's Faculty of Organizational Sciences, researching how attachment styles affect leadership performance and how traditional holistic practices can enhance it. During the Humphrey Fellowship year, Milakovic focused on professional development in DEI. An internationally recognized scholar, Milakovic has received multiple awards and scholarships, including those from the Indonesian and Japanese governments.



Ana Bachurova Humphrey Fellow University of California, Davis, 2022-2023

Ana Bachurova is a sustainability professional with 15 years of experience in environmental governance and climate finance. Prior to her Humphrey Fellowship, Ana worked at the European Bank for Reconstruction and Development, where she managed a portfolio of policy dialogue assignments for the countries in the Western Balkans. Right after that, she joined the Stockholm Environment Institute and worked on climate investment plans for EU cities. Currently, Ana is a Consultant for UNEP FI, managing a Europe-wide initiative to promote investments in energy efficiency among financial institutions. Ana holds a B.Sc. in Environmental and Resources Management from the Brandenburg University of Technology, an M.Sc. in Environmental Governance from the University of Freiburg, and an MBA from the Yale School of Management. Her academic training, multidisciplinary skills, and on-the-ground exposure to decision-making processes allow her to position environmental and climate topics at the heart of local and regional development initiatives.







Ruslana Kuzina Humphrey Fellow Pennsylvania State University, 2018-2019

Prof. Ruslana Kuzina is a Postdoctoral researcher in KU Leuven (Belgium), MSCA fellow 2023- 2025, Doctor of Science, Hubert H. Humphrey Fellow (USA), Pennsylvania State University (2018-2019), Accounting professor at the Odessa National University of Economics (Ukraine). Since March 2022 she has been a Visiting professor in KU Leuven and then obtained the MSCA4Ukraine fellowship. With a solid background in accounting and finance, she specializes in integrating international standards and sustainability concepts into university curricula and professional development programs in Ukraine. Her journey began at Odessa National Economic University, where Mrs. Kuzina explored the intersection of accounting and sustainability, culminating in doctoral research on corporate reporting. She was a Head of Department of accounting (2015-2018) at the Odessa National University of Economics (Ukraine). Methodologist, accredited tutor of the Institute of Certified Financial Managers UK, International Network ICB & Lamp; ICFM (UK). She is certified auditor and member of Chamber of Auditors (Ukraine).

PANEL DISCUSSION III: Rule of Law and Trust in Democratic Institutions as a Condition to Build Resilient Society



Naďa Rošteková Humphrey Fellow American University, 2007-2008

Naďa Rošteková is a lawyer by profession. Her main focus is on compliance issues and topics such as competition, business ethics, whistleblowing, and GDPR, among others. After years at the top management in the refinery Slovnaft, leading a team of lawyers and compliance specialists across various countries in the CEE region, she has moved back to legal services. Currently, she focuses on business sustainability and EC regulations on ESG (environmental – social – governance) aspects and their meaningful implementation across various types of businesses. She practices in Slovakia and the Czech Republic.



Andrii Paziuk Humphrey Fellow American University, 2017-2018

Dr. Andrii Paziuk was a Humphrey Fellow at the American University Washington College of Law. Currently, he serves as a Professor of International Law at the National Aviation University in Kyiv. He specializes in cybersecurity, cybercrime, cyberwarfare, technology, and human rights law. Beyond academia, Dr. Paziuk is deeply engaged in international development, particularly in his role since December 2023, supporting the World Bankfunded Digital Resilience Strategy for the Government of Ukraine. His responsibilities include researching cybersecurity, privacy, and digital resilience policies, identifying regulatory gaps, and providing strategic recommendations. Dr. Paziuk advises the Ukrainian government on cybersecurity and data governance strategies, risk analysis, and national preparedness and has served as a legal expert for the Council of Europe and USAID.







Trim Berisha Humphrey Fellow Syracuse University, 2023-2024

Trim Berisha was part of the 2023-24 Humphrey Fellow cohort at Syracuse University, where he studied Leadership, Public Administration, and Public Policy Analysis at the Maxwell School. He earned a Certificate in Public Leadership and Management and is now enrolled in the Executive Master of Public Administration program. During his fellowship, Trim made his professional affiliation with Onondaga County's Infrastructure Department for four weeks, where he helped prepare the Capital Improvement Plan and develop an online management program for capital investments.



Ioana Mihaela Morar Humphrey Fellow University of Minnesota, 2022-2023

Dr. Ioana Mihaela Morar is a driven mid-career leader in public service, with 20+ years of continuous work in the prison system (at both middle and top-level management - deputy general director, director general ad-interinr, director of the Social Reintegration Department, head of the Psycho-social Assistance Service). Her areas of expertise include: Prison management and administration, knowing the system from the inside; Treatment of inmates and rehabilitation; The academic perspective, holding a PhD in Psychology.



Boban Bragorski Humphrey Fellow University of Minnesota, 2020-2021

Mr. Boban Bragorski is a Public Policy Manager at the American Chamber of Commerce in North Macedonia. He is primarily responsible for defining the strategic approach and coordinating activities related to public policies for which members advocate. Mr. Bragorski's work spans multiple policy areas: enhancing the rule of law, improving public policymaking, advancing digital transformation, improving the healthcare system, and helping businesses integrate sustainable practices. With 20 years of experience in journalism, she has hosted broadcasts and special coverage events, participated in round tables and seminars around the world, and has taught classes on a wide range of subjects, including democracy and rule of law, voting, minority rights, and pluralism. Moralic holds a Master's degree in Comparative Politics from the University of Zagreb and is a Fulbright scholar, having spent a year as a H. Humphrey fellow at the Walter Cronkite School of Journalism and Mass Communication at Arizona State University in the United States.



Darko Ivanovic Humphrey Fellow Arizona State University, 2015-2016

Darko is an entrepreneur, media innovator, and educator with extensive experience in technology and communication. PANEL DISCUSSION V: Educational Reform to Keep Talents at Home



Július Rozenfeld Humphrey Fellow Vanderbilt University, 2018-2019

Dr. Julius Rozenfeld is an assistant professor and the deputy head of the Department of British and American Studies at Pavol Jozef Šafárik University in Kosice. He has been working in academia since 2007. His main area of research is culture in various contexts. Currently, he focuses on political discourse analysis. In his research, he seeks answers to the question of how political debates interact with different realms of culture and influence processes of identity formation. Dr. Rozenfeld is a teacher trainer and leads a number of courses such as Contemporary USA, European Studies, and Intercultural Communication.



Gordana Vlahovic Humphrey Fellow Pennsylvania State University, 2018-2019

In her capacity as the Head of the International Relations & Project Office, Gordana actively leads the processes of comprehensive internationalization of higher education and research on the institutional level, coordinates academic mobility and studies abroad, institutional capacity building, and policymaking. Among the highlights of her Humphrey alumna professional achievements is that the ACE Model for Comprehensive Internationalization, which she explored during the fellowship, is successfully implemented to reflect the needs of her own academic landscape and beyond. Elisaveta has worked for the Bulgarian government EC, intergovernmental, and international institutions, as well as for the Task Force for Global Health and the Emory Global Health Institute. Elisaveta is committed to social justice and volunteers for initiatives related to children's rights, poverty alleviation, and animal rights. The Kamzík TV Tower, stands 196 meters tall. Situated at 437 meters above sea level on Kamzík Hill, part of the Little Carpathians, it offers expansive views of the city. The tower features a public observation deck, providing clear views of Austria, Hungary, and the Czech Republic on days with good visibility. Built in 1975, it replaced an older transmission tower.



The Slovak Radio Building, often called the Radio Diamant by locals, is designed in the form of an inverted pyramid. It was created by architects Š. Svetko, Š. Ďurkovič, and B. Kissling and was finished in 1983.

The Old Town Hall, a 14thcentury complex in Bratislava's Old Town. houses the Bratislava City Museum, the city's oldest museum. established in 1868. It offers exhibits on local history and torture devices. The tower provides panoramic views of the Old Town.

The Secondary Industrial School of Mechanical Engineering is one of the oldest specialized schools for technical fields in Slovakia and is located on the left bank of the Danube River.

St. Martin's Cathedral is originally a Gothic sacred building located in the historic zone of Bratislava. It is the most significant and largest church in Bratislava. It is one of the most prominent landmarks in Bratislava and, after Bratislava Castle, is the second most visited tourist attraction in the capital of Slovakia.

Czechoslovakian central bank and managed the Slovak koruna until 2008, Its headquarters, inaugurated on May 23, 2002, reaches a height of 111.6 meters with 33 floors, making it the tallest nonantenna building in Bratislava until 2020.

The historic Neo-Renaissance building of the Slovak National Theater on Hviezdoslav Square, a national cultural monument served as the theater's main venue until the newer building was completed in 2007.

In Bratislava, Michael's Gate is the only remaining city gate from the medieval fortifications and is among the oldest buildings in the city. Constructed around 1300, it was remodeled in Baroque style in 1758, when the statue of St. Michael and the Dragon was added to the top.

Bridge of the Slovak National Uprising, referred to as UFO Bridge is a road bridge over the Danube with restaurant on the top. It is the world's longest bridge to have one pylon and one cable-stayed plane.
